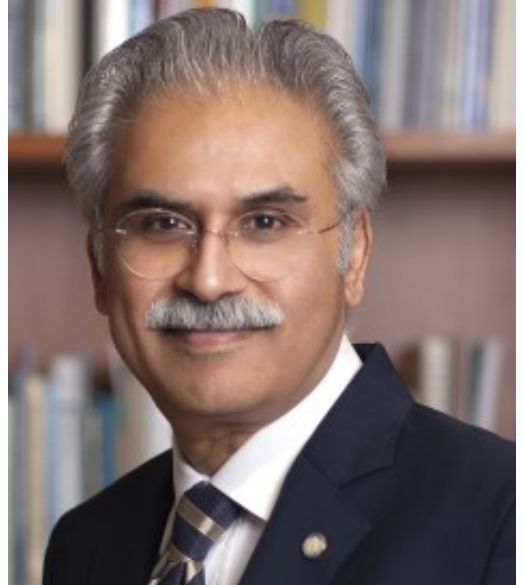


Dr Zafar Mirza, Director, Health System Development □

For 12 years before joining WHO, he was a founder Executive Director of a civil society organization – The Network for Consumer Protection in Pakistan.
