Working for the WHO Regional Office provided me with an excellent opportunity to meet a vast array of experts and professionals working in various fields of public health.

I am a medical doctor from Egypt with a masters degree in international health from Heidelberg University, Germany.

- reviewing the content and language of a short Arabic course entitled "Accelerating progress towards the health-related Sustainable Development Goals".

Meeting the other fellows in the office was also a fun experience. I organized different events for us to familiarize ourselves with Cairo and visit some of Cairo's famous landmarks and touristic places. These experiences were also invaluable.

I would tell any fellow to be proactive, make use of opportunities presented and do not hesitate to approach people to share new ideas. There is much to learn from engaging with others.
