#### **BACKGROUND**

The Leadership for Health (LfH) Programme is an initiative of the WHO Regional Office for the Eastern Mediterranean that aims at establishing a critical mass of public health leaders in the Region. Following a very successful first round in 2014–2015, the WHO Regional Office will a offer second round of the programme, in collaboration with Harvard T.H. Chan School of Public Health for 2015–2016.

#### **DURATION**

The programme will comprise two phases. The first will be in Cairo from 15 to 27 November 2015. The second phase will be in Geneva from 20 to 30 January 2016. Between the two phases, participants will write papers focusing on specific leadership challenges in their respective countries.

#### METHODS AND APPROACH

The programme will utilize non-traditional teaching methods and focus on competencies in public health, leadership and leading change; politics of well-being and political analysis; organizational dynamics and change management; team-building, negotiation; system-wide thinking and problem-solving for health system strengthening.

## **PARTICIPANTS**

Participants for the LfH Programme will be public health professionals who have:

- prior training and qualifications in public health
- experience in responsible management and/or leadership positions in public health or health management
- demonstrated capacity of high performance, e.g. in public health practice, training or research programmes
- good listening, speaking, and writing abilities in English.

The programme strongly encourages the participation of women.

#### **OUTCOMES**

The LfH Programme will establish leaders who can:

- proactively tackle national and local health problems that directly impact population health
- effectively pursue the five regional health priorities endorsed by Member States of the Region
- play active roles in the global public health sphere for the health and socioeconomic well-being of populations.
