



## KEY EQUIPMENT AND SUPPLIES PROVIDED

The UN has procured and provided a substantial package of essential COVID-19 medical and laboratory supplies and equipment. This includes some items listed below.

- 98 Ventilators
- 37.2M Masks
- 1,778 Oxygen Concentrator Machines
- 6.8M Gloves
- 19 PCR Machines
- 1,581 RNA Extraction Kits

## TRAININGS DELIVERED

- 215,000+ Health workers (including polio health workers), government and NGO staff trained on **surveillance**
- 22,000 Health workers trained on **infection, prevention and control**
- 2,300 Health workers trained on **ICU and case management**
- 170 Laboratory staff trained on **COVID-19 testing**

## TRACKING AND RESPONDING

- 4.6M People screened at points of entry
- 180+ Staff deployed at points of entry
- 300+ Points of entry staff trained
- 307 Rapid Response Teams trained and 43 new units established to support contact tracing and referrals
- 29 Fixed Response Teams trained and 15 new units established to support contact tracing and referrals
- 18 Mobile Health Teams established

## RAISING AWARENESS

- 270,000+ Health workers and mobilisers oriented on delivering preventative messages
- 1,600 TV spots broadcast
- 144,000 Radio spots broadcast
- 1,400+ Billboards placed
- 9.4M Posters and brochures distributed
- 68,000 Community awareness sessions conducted
- 1.9M People reached through social media
- Risk Communication and Community Engagement (RCCE) Working Group established to coordinate RCCE activities
