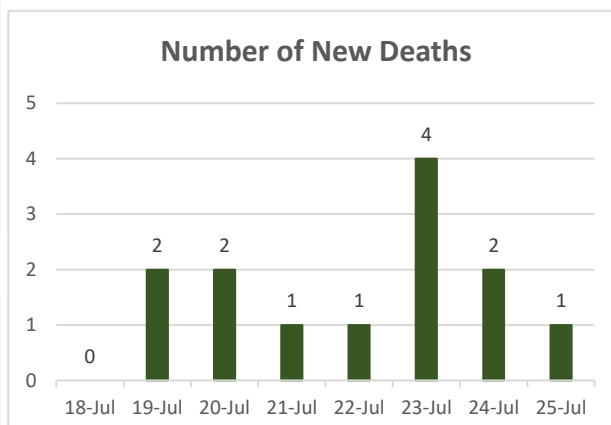
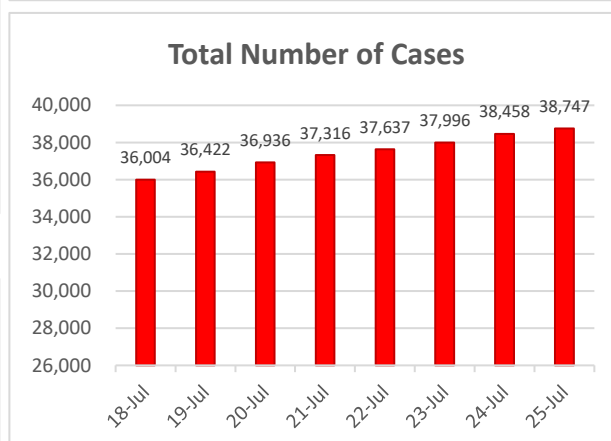
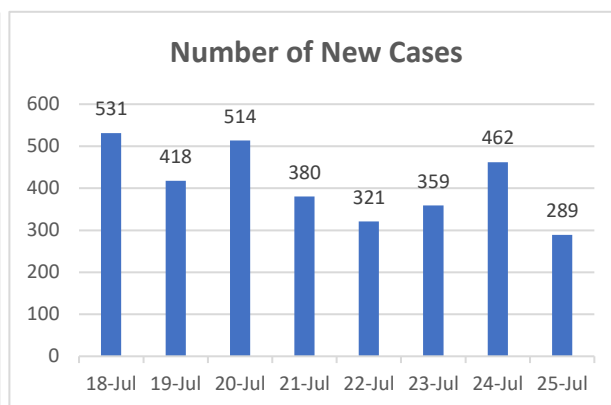

HIGHLIGHTS

- The mortalities were 3 Bahraini male citizens (57, 65 and 66 years old) and 4 male expatriates (35, 61, 63 and 78 years old).
- More than 10,000 food parcels were distributed to migrant workers' accommodation in the Muharraq Governorate.
- Gyms, swimming pools and outdoor sport fields will be reopened on August 6 following recommendations by the National Taskforce to Combat COVID-19.
- Saudis living in Bahrain can return home via the King Fahad Causeway starting from July 23.
- MoH participates in the virtual meeting on Evaluating Progress of the 3 Billion Goals of the WHO's Program of Action.
