HIGHLIGHTS

- \bullet The mortality were: a 55 years old female Bahrainin Citizen and 2 male expatriates (42 and 49 years old).
- Ministry of Education announced that: School Year will start in September 2020.
- Most retailers in Bahrain are to increase investment in online retailing and delivery apps, in the wake of the coronavirus pandemic.
- Ministry of Health has introduced a home delivery service of medicines. The system received positive feedbacks from patients and their families, as it ensures health, safety and comfort of patients and visitors.
- The Capital's Governor launched a campaign: "Because You Are Important" for confronting Corona virus and impacts.
- The President of the Friends of Health Association articulated that: Neglect and carelessness in following the precautionary procedures has dreadful consequences in facing Corona.
- The Head of the Great Ajam Memorial stated that: Safety measures during the Ashura season are an integral part of the safety procedures.
- The Head of the Madan memorial commented that: Structural decisions in light of the directives of Bahrain team to respond to the Corona pandemic ensure that the number of cases will not increase.
- The Assistant Head of the Zahra memorial in Ras Rumman stressed: To strictly follow the precautionary measures is compulsory in the current circumstances.
- Praising the decision of the Jaafari Endowment to limit the sermons to less than twenty minutes pronounces that: Adherence to the instructions issued by the Bahrain team will preserve public health.
