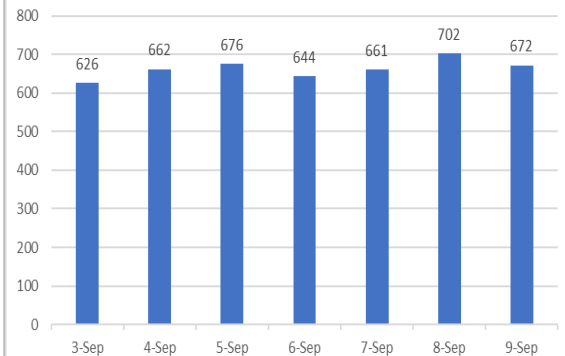

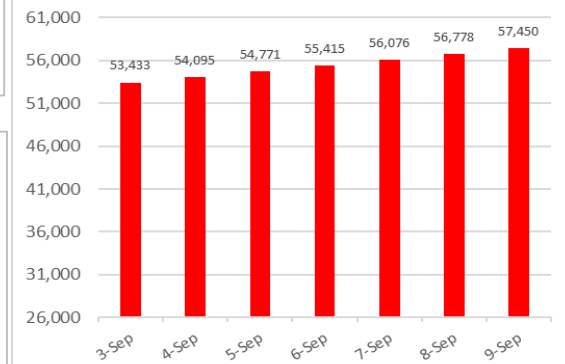
## HIGHLIGHTS

- The mortality was a 75 year old male Bahraini citizen.
- Ministry of Health confirmed early access to existing cases and contacts by expanding number of daily tests and random checks and speeding up treatment and recovery.
- MOH aims at reaching 6000 participants, every volunteers in (Covid-19) clinical trials has a positive footprint in the history of humanity leading to a successful approval of vaccines by WHO.
- MOH: The potential vaccine listed by WHO and approved by National Health Regulatory Authority is inactive, causes no infection but contributes to creating antibodies to stimulate immunity and infection resistance.
- MOH: Commended medical and nursing staff volunteers praising their continuous frontline efforts to combat the pandemic.
- MOH: Isolation and treatment capacity is 8149 beds, of which 1566 beds occupied representing 19.2% of the total capacity.
- MOH Undersecretary: The percentage of recovered people reached 90.83% while the case fatality rate is 0.35%.
- MOH Undersecretary: Called on all members of society to stay away from gatherings during the next two weeks, and to adhere to precautionary measures to reduce Covid-19 cases.
- MOH Assistant Undersecretary for Primary Care launched the electronic training course "Primary Health Care Practices", ensuring that primary care is integrated into the response to the Covid-19 pandemic.
- National Taskforce for Combating the Coronavirus reiterated the need to avoid gatherings during the next two weeks to reduce Coronavirus infection rate.
- Ministry of Education: Private educational institutions are responsible for reviewing the digital educational contents, ensuring no conflicts with law and value.
- Parliamentarian Woman and Child Committee Chairwoman and five MPs urging the push back of private schools start up until further notice.
- Pivotal roles of Physiotherapists in treatment and rehabilitation of Covid-19 patients was highlighted as Bahrain marked the Physical Therapy Day on 8 September, 2020.
- Senior officials around the world are showing a "strong desire" to attend Bahrain's premier annual Security Summit despite Covid-19 pandemic.

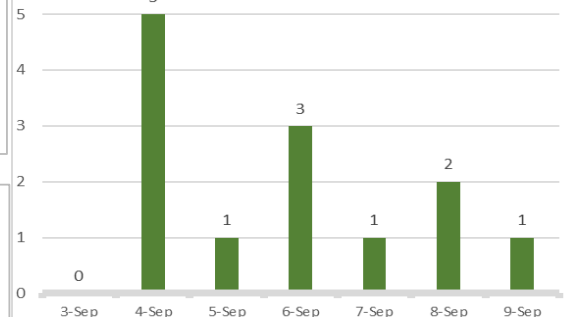
Number of New Cases
