HIGHLIGHTS

- The mortality was a 64 male Bahraini citizen.
- MOH: Bahrain registered its highest number of active Covid-19 cases (totaling 6.183) vesterday.
- MOH: Increasing Covid-19 cases amongst immune-compromised groups is a critical indicator of contacts increase in society.
- Chief Assistant of Public Security reiterated that citizens and residents' awareness is fundamental for combatting Covid-19 pandemic.
- Gulf Air will resume its direct flights to/from India staring on 14 September 2020.
- British Airways plan to resume direct flights between Bahrain and England early next month is a timely
- boost for tourism and business after emerging from the Covid-19 crisis.
