HIGHLIGHTS

- The mortality were: a 80 years old male Bahraini Citizen, a 60 and 76 years old female Bahraini Citizen.
- His Majesty the King chaired the weekly Cabinet session, in the presence of HRH the Crown Prince, commanding the continuation of Bahrain fight against Covid-19; and HE the Minister of Health hailed the keynote of His Majesty.
- MOH Assistant Undersecretary for Public Health stressed that medical personnel at the forefront to respond to Coronavirus have proven high competence to tackle the pandemic.
- Volunteers for clinical trials reiterated their role in establishing the infrastructure needed for medical studies, expressing great confidence in the medical staff professionalism.
- Launch of the third edition of "King Hamad Youth Empowerment Award to Achieve the SDGs".
- Eight out of 10 responded to a new survey in Bahrain, stating that they have received no rent reductions from landlords in response to the Covid-19 outbreak.
- Gulf Air announced adding New Delhi to current list of destinations, resuming its direct flights to the country.
- Despite dismay of owners, "Sheesha" café will stay closed for another month to combat the recent spike in Covid-19 cases.




