HIGHLIGHTS

- The mortality were: a 67, 75 and 71 years old male Bahraini Citizen and a 52 years old male expatriate.
- National Medical Taskforce for Combating the Coronavirus provided updates on the COVID-19 response in Bahrain: stating that preventive and precautionary measures to limit the spread of Coronavirus are not new and
- adhered to previously to flatten the epidemiological curve.

 National Taskforce for Combating the Coronavirus continues to study indicators and review developments related to the Coronavirus based on the data and present recommendations.
- •MOH Undersecretary revealed that 87% of the members of the administrative, educational and technical bodies in governmental schools have been examined so far, and the remaining 13% are scheduled. Only 1% have tested positive.

 • The rate of COVID-19 recovering patients reached 89.41%, while the death rate is about 0.34%
- A call for COVID-19 recovered patients to donate convalescent plasma for treatments of existing Coronavirus cases in Bahrain.
