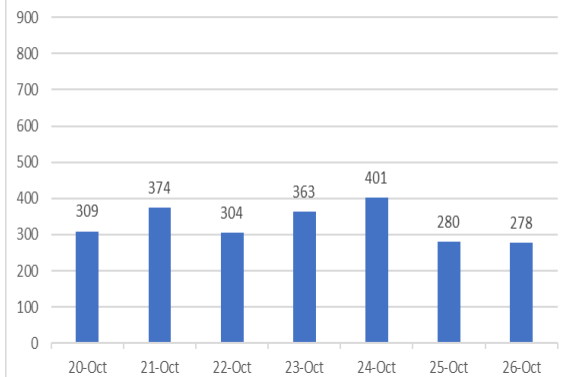

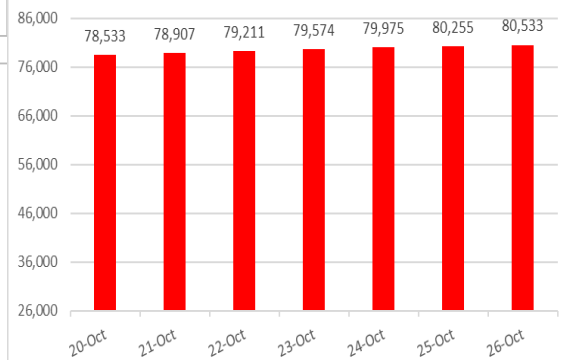
HIGHLIGHTS

- The mortality were: 4 Bahraini Citizens (2 female (36 and 64 years old) and 2 male (54 and 65 years old)).
- Minister of Foreign Affairs participated in the high-level meeting to celebrate the 75th Anniversary of the United Nations.
- Ministry of Education-School Health Department started daily inspection visits to Bahrain schools after students' partial return.
- Supreme Council for Islamic Affairs (SCIA) announced that Bahrain's mosques will re-open for Dhuhur (Noon) Prayers starting 1 November 2020.
- The Government extended by three months assistance programs to companies severely affected by COVID-19.
- The Southern Governorate carried out an awareness campaign targeting food truck workers.

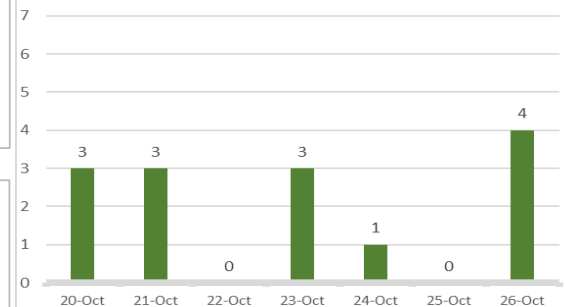
Number of New Cases
