#### **HIGHLIGHTS**

- The mortality were: 3 Bahraini Citizens [2 male (63 and 64 years old) and 1 female (54 years old)].
  H.E. the Minister of Health issued an order allowing six customers to sit at the same table in restaurants and coffee shops (rather than five).
  The Crown Prince Center for Training and Medical Research obtained international accreditation certificate from the Saudi
- His Majesty the King Hamad received condolences from World leaders on the passing of His Royal Highness Prince Khalifa bin Salman Al Khalifa the late Primer
- COVID19 is still on the rise in WHO/EMRO; in past week, 63% of cases were reported from 3 countries: Iran, Jordan, Morocco. 58% of deaths were reported from Iran. Jordan had the largest relative increase in deaths from the week before (+44%) then Tunisia (+15%) & Lebanon (+12%).
