HIGHLIGHTS

- The Mortality was a 81 year old male Bahraini citizens.
 H.M. the King's directives to provide a safe COVID-19 vaccine for all citizens and residents was praised by the Minister of Health.
 National Medical Taskforce for Combating the Coronavirus (COVID-19) held a press conference and provided an update on the COVID-19.

- National Medical resource for Contenting the Contenting the Spread of COVID-19, including the team of first responders, medical professionals, the Kingdom.
 MOH commended Bharian's relentless efforts in mitigating the spread of COVID-19, including the team of first responders, medical professionals, military and security staff, and governmental agencies.
 MOH reterated that the Kingdom has ordered more than one million vaccine doses from several companies, and will be amongst the first countries to receive the vaccines soon after international approval.
 MOH revealed that two million PCR tests have been administered so far and more than 50% of the Bahrain's population has been tested at least once; and the Kingdom is ranking amongst the highest in rate of testing globally.
 MOH highlighted that Bahrain's effective precautionary measures and strategies received international recognition, placing the Kingdom at the forefront of COVID-19 country responses worldwide.
 MOH advised that current recovery rate is 97.84% with a 0.39% death rate. Isolation centre capacity is at 6%, with 416 out of 6,346 beds occupied and 1,094 cases are under in self-isolation.
 The 15-minute COVID-19 agond Arnigen test, along with the ability to report results via the new service by the "BeAware Bahrain" App

 The 15-minute COVID-19 Rapid Antigen test, along with the ability to report results via the new service by the "BeAware Bahrain" Alexa allows users to immediately send their test results to the Ministry of Health, thereafter a SMS report serial number is sent to the user who will be contacted by a medical professional.

 Two Covid-19 testing centres and a special isolation room are set up at Bahrain International Circuit (BIC) in Sakhir as part of medical safety procedures introduced for Formula 1.
