#### **HIGHLIGHTS**

- The mortality was a 69 year old male Bahraini Citizens.
  Ministry of Health (MOH) revealed that total number of individuals vaccinated as of 30 December 2020 is 57,317.
  MOH Underscertary reiterated that over one million vaccine doses have been on order since August, with Bahrain being globally amongst the first countries.
  MOH Underscertary indicated that average number of daily new active cases as a percentage of daily COVID-19 tests during the first three weeks of December was approximately 1.5%, increasing to 2.4% from the 24th to 28th, reflecting an increase of 34% in the average of daily new active rases.

   MOH Undersecretary emphasized the importance of adhering to all precautionary measures, including limiting gatherings to members of same households or close social circle and utilizing outdoor open passes, while observing social distancing guidelines.

   MOH Undersecretary revealed current COVID-19 recovery rate at 97.43% with about 0.38% case fatality rate; while occupancy at isolation centers stands at 8.0% with \$4.00 beds occupied out of 6,078 available, and 1,474 asymptomatic cases are under optional home self-loabition.

   Infectious and internal Diseases Experts in Bahrain stressed the importance of continuing to support national efforts to defeat COVID-19 by complying with all hygienic precautionary and social distancing measures, especially during the new year occasion, as well as wearing face masks in public.
