#### **HIGHLIGHTS**

- The mortality were: a 67, 73 and 99 years old male Bahrainin Citizen.
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  Increasing number of citizens and existents continue to take COVID-19 vaccine in Bahrain; and Ministry of Health (MOH) revealed that total number of individuals vaccinated as of 6 February 2021 is 182,543.
  In response to recommendations made by the National Medical Taskforce to combatting the COVID-19, the following decisions were made, to be implemented from 07 February to 20 February:

  Government entities and institutions to allow a maximum of 70% of employees to work from home.

  Temporary closure of in-door gyms and sports halls, and swimming pools, while outdoor exercising for gyms and sports halls may continue with a maximum of 30 individuals.

  Temporary suspension of indoor exercise classes.

  The prohibition of all social gatherings or private events held at home, and private locations, with more than 30 individuals.


  An overcrowded labour accommodation facility in Malkiya was found lacking basic health, safety and security measures.

  People who have come in contact with active COVID-19 cases have been warred against visiting random testing locations.
