
- The mortality were: 4 Bahraini citizens [3 female[ 64, 66 and 66 years old)] and 1 male [80 years old)], and 4 expatriates [1 female (79 Year old)] and 3 male (38, 60 and 66 years old)].
  Increasing number of citizens and residents continue to take COVID-19 vaccine in Bahrain; and Ministry of Health (MOH) revealed that total number of individuals vaccinated as of 10 February 2021 is 219,595.
  The Kingdom of Bahrain authorized the emergency use of the Sputnik V vaccine.
  WOH Underscretary underling the national duty, called for a full public commitment on COVID-19 preventive measures.
