

- Dr Atatrah met H.E Minister of Information and expressed her thanks and appreciation to H.E for his kind reception, praising the diligent and distinguished efforts made by the Kingdom of Bahrain in confronting the Corona virus (Covid 19)
- Bahrain travel advisory update Bahrain's Civil Aviation Affairs has updated Kingdom's Red List countries, in line with directives issued by the Government Executive Committee in response to recommendations made by the National Medical Taskforce for Combatting the Coronavirus
- The National Medical Taskforce updates the maximum capacity for cinemas under the Yellow Alert Level The National Medical Taskforce for Combatting the Coronavirus (COVID-19) has announced that cinemas will operate at 30% capacity starting today, 05 August 2021
- The Kingdom of Bahrain's National Health Regulatory Authority (NHRA) has authorized a clinical study to evaluate the use of "Enovid" nasal spray to treat individuals with COVID-19. The authorization follows a medical study submitted by the relevant authorities at the Ministry of Health, which indicates their support for a clinical trial to take place in the Kingdom of Bahrain. "Enovid" will be tested on volunteers who have already been diagnosed with COVID-19 and who are suffering from mild symptoms
- Bahrain's embassy in the Hashemite kingdom of Jordan started (3 August) vaccinating Bahraini citizens in Amman, at the Abdali Hospital, under the supervision of a Bahraini medical team
- Bahrain's embassy in the Arab Republic of Egypt started (3 August) the vaccination process for all Bahraini citizens and students in the Arab Republic of Egypt who
  have signed up to get vaccinated against Covid-19
- The National Medical Taskforce for Combatting the Coronavirus (COVID-19) stressed the importance of adhering to all Yellow Alert Level precautionary measures including maintaining social distancing measures and wearing a mask when in public areas which are in effect from 1 August 2021
- Bahrain moves to the Covid-19 "yellow alert" level from 1 August until further notice
- France has added Bahrain to its travel "green list" effective from 1 August 2021
- The National Vaccination Campaign continues across the Kingdom of Bahrain
- The Ministry of Health announces: The extension of the date to receive a second dose of the Sputnik vaccination due to the rescheduling of production and supply
  operations of the manufacturer
  - The National Medical Taskforce for Combatting COVID-19: the goal is to administer booster shots to 95,000 individuals aged 40 and above to reach a target of 80%
- Due to the increase in the spread of the mutated virus "Delta" in many countries, in addition to the stability of the effectiveness of vaccination and the booster dose of it in enhancing immunity and protecting against the effects of the virus, the transition to the **yellow level** has been carried out until 80% of adults 40 years and over are vaccinated with the booster dose
