

- Green level to take effect starting September 3
- Booster dose goal reached 200,000 jabs in 23 days on Tuesday with 200,093 shots
- WHO Representative and Head of Office in Bahrain, Dr. Tasnim Atatrah congratulated the Team of Bahrain for competing in Tokyo 2020 Summer Paralympic Games

- An increase in taking the anti-Coronavirus (Covid-19) vaccination for the age group from 3 to 11 years in order to preserve the health and safety of all
- The National Medical Team: Global studies show a decrease in antibodies within six months of receiving the second dose of a COVID-19 vaccine
- The Civil Aviation Affairs (CAA) has updated the Kingdom of Bahrain's travel entry procedures at Bahrain International Airport Starting from Sunday, 29 August 2021
- Bahrain has succeeded in flattening the curve of new daily Covid-19 infections in less than 60 days (from June 29 until 22 August)
- The National Vaccination Campaign continues across the Kingdom of Bahrain
- Due to the increase in the spread of the mutated virus "Delta" in many countries, in addition to the stability of the effectiveness of vaccination and the booster dose of it in enhancing immunity and protecting against the effects of the virus, the transition to the yellow level has been carried out until 80% of adults 40 years and over are vaccinated with the booster dose
