

HIGHLIGHTS

- Green level to take effect starting September 3
- WHO Representative and the Environment Authority discussed means of cooperation including providing support to conduct studies on air quality and support Bahrain in addressing environmental issues
- WHO Representative conducted a discussion with WHO Regional Office Communicable Disease Director and the COVID-19 Vaccine Focal Point to discuss Bahrain's experience in expanding COVID-19 Vaccine coverage. The discussin was with the Undersecretary Ministry of Health and the Representative of COVID-19 National Taskforce.
- Individuals Vaccinated aged 40 and above and those with comorbidities 204,452 (80.2%)
- · The National Medical Team: 80% of adults aged 40 years and over are vaccinated with the booster dose
- A study by the National Medical Taskforce for Combating the Coronavirus said that 996,403 people in Bahrain had taken two doses
 of vaccines between December 9, 2020 and July 17, 2021 (75% of citizins and residents)
- 88% of the deaths related to the COVID-19 are among non-vaccinated people, declraed by a study of the National Medical Taskforce for Combating the Coronavirus
- From midnight on Sunday, 29 August 2021, the quarantine period was reduced to 5 days for all unvaccinated passengers aged 6-12 entering the Kingdom of Bahrain from non-red list countries
- · All passenger arriving from red list countries, including those who are under the age of 6, must quarantine for 10 days
- The Information and eGovernment Authority (iGA) has invited all public and private sector employees to avail of the Periodic Medical Checkup Appointment service via the National Portal, bahrain.bh
- An increase in taking the anti-Coronavirus (Covid-19) vaccination for the age group from 3 to 11 years in order to preserve the health and safety of all
- The National Medical Team: Global studies show a decrease in antibodies within six months of receiving the second dose of a COVID-19 vaccine
- The Civil Aviation Affairs (CAA) has updated the Kingdom of Bahrain's travel entry procedures at Bahrain International Airport Starting from Sunday, 29 August 2021
- The National Vaccination Campaign continues across the Kingdom of Bahrain
- Due to the increase in the spread of the mutated virus "Delta" in many countries, in addition to the stability of the effectiveness of vaccination and the booster dose of it in enhancing immunity and protecting against the effects of the virus, the transition to the yellow level has been carried out until 80% of adults 40 years and over are vaccinated with the booster dose
