

Based on the average percentage of cases to tests, in addition to the level of occupancy in intensive care units. The Green Level is adopted when the rolling average percentage of positive cases out of tests carried out is below 2% for 14 days.

HIGHLIGHTS

Covid-19 Case Status –as of 22th of September 2021

The country has maintained a zero percentage death rate for 28 consecutive days. The percentage of new positive cases from tests taken on the 22nd of September 2021 was 0.45%, forming an average of between 0.53% (average/3 days) and 0.50% (average/14 days). The total number of recoveries is 272,387; the total number of deaths is 1,388. There are currently 745 stable cases, with four classed as critical, and seven active cases are receiving treatment.

All services provided at the Bahrain International Exhibition and Convention Centre transfered to Bahrain International Hospital and Sitra Mall, Monday20 September 2021

The Ministry of Health announced the transfer of all COVID-19 related health services provided at the Bahrain International Exhibition and Convention Centre to be transferred to Bahrain International Hospital and Sitra Mall starting Monday, 20 September 2021. Vaccination services were transferred to Sitra Mall. While health care services for patients under self-isolation were transferred to the Bahrain International Hospital. The Ministry of Health called on all patients with mild and moderate symptoms who require health care and are under self-isolation to head directly to the Bahrain International Hospital without calling 444. Daily vaccination services continued at all health centres across the Kingdom.
