Sinopharm vaccine approved for all children aged 3 to 11

The National Medical Taskforce for Combatting the Coronavirus (COVID-19) announced that following approval by the Vaccination Committee, all children aged 3 to 11 will be eligible to receive two doses of the Sinopharm vaccine, starting Wednesday, 27 October 2021. The Taskforce noted that the decision was taken following a thorough review of all medical health and safety recommendations conducted by the Vaccination Committee, adding that the move aims to preserve public health. Additionally, the Pfizer-BioNTech vaccine will soon be approved for children aged 5 to 11 age who will be eligible to receive two doses.

Covid-19 fight success as cases touch record low

Bahrain recorded 27 new cases of the coronavirus (Covid-19) on Tuesday, the lowest ever witnessed since the pandemic gained momentum in March last year. Bahrain's success in combating Covid-19 has been attributed to its TTT policy - Trace, Test and Treat – a proven strategy which tracks people infected and traces their contacts, helping to reduce the spread of the virus. Experts estimate that 'herd immunity' would require around 80-90pc of the population to have Covid-19 immunity, either through prior infection or vaccination.

Covid-19 Case Status –as of 28th of October 2021

The percentage of new positive cases from tests taken on the 27th of October 2021 was 0.32%, forming an average of between 0.27% (average/3 days) and 0.38% (average/14 days). The total number of recoveries is 274,730; the total number of deaths is 1,393. There are currently 560 stable cases, with two classed as critical, and six active cases are
