

Data as reported by national authorities by 24:00 local time 26 November 2021

The alert level is dependent on the rolling average of positive cases in Intensive Care Units. The Green Alert applies when the rolling average of positive cases in ICU is 50 or less for 14 days.



HIGHLIGHTS

The Ministry of Health opens a new drive-through testing centre in the Northern Governorate

The Ministry of Health announced the opening of a new drive-through testing centre in the Northern Governorate in Salman City. Testing appointments at the facility could be booked from Monday, 22 November 2021. The Ministry stated that the new centre has been equipped with the latest medical equipment, which includes lanes to receives vehicles for sample collection. The Ministry reiterated the importance of adhering to all COVID-19 precautionary measures issued by the National Medical Taskforce for Combatting the Coronavirus (COVID-19).

Eligible individuals can receive their vaccinations across the Kingdom's health centres

The Ministry of Health announced that starting from 29 November 2021, eligible individuals can head directly to health centres across the Kingdom to receive a COVID-19 vaccination, without the need to book an appointment. Health centres will be open from 07:30 to 17:00, with vaccination availability varying between health centres.

TRAVEL UPDATES

The Red List is regularly reviewed and updated based on the National Medical Taskforce for Combatting the Coronavirus (COVID-19) assessment of international developments.

26 November 2021: The Civil Aviation Affairs has reinstated Bahrain's Red List countries in response to recommendations made by the National Taskforce for Combatting the Coronavirus (COVID-19). Six countries were added.

27 November 2021: Four additional countries have been added to the Kingdom's Red List.

According to the new update; The Red List include the Republic of South Africa, the Republic of Namibia, the Republic of Botswana, the Republic of Zimbabwe, the Kingdom of Lesotho, the Kingdom of Eswatini, the Republic of Malawi, the Republic of Mozambique, the Republic of Angola and the Republic of Zambia.

WHO BAHRAIN COUNTRY OFFICE HIGHLIGHTS

UN Interagency Task Force (UNIATF) WHO HQ and WHO EMRO joint NCD mission to Bahrain 9 - 11 November

The mission discussed the progress and challenges of Non-communicable Diseases (NCD). The mission members acknowledged the high political commitment towards addressing NCDs and the progress achieved. Continued efforts in strengthening and scaling up the implementation of cost-effective NCD preventive and clinical interventions are likely to see Bahrain achieve the SDG 3.4.1 target on reduction of NCD premature mortality by 1/3 in 2030.

WHO Bahrain, EMRO and HQ "Report: Covid-19 Success Story" Mission to Bahrain 4 - 11 November

Field visits were conducted across multiple areas of operation: Testing and Laboratories; Vaccination Centres; Contact Tracing; Continuity of Care; Testing Centres; War Room; and the Hospital and ICU.
