#### **HIGHLIGHTS**

- Approximately 114,100 tests were conducted.
- 58 newly confirmed cases, bringing total to 2,647.
- At present there are 1,450 active cases still receiving treatment, 2 of them in critical condition; 1,189 individuals were discharged.
- No mortality recorded and no community transmission recorded.
- Repatriation of Bahraini citizens continue.
- WHO scientific brief discusses the role of COVID-19 antibodies showing that there is no evidence that they protect from reinfection (see link below).
