## Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19)

### **HIGHLIGHTS**

- Approximately 205,600 tests were conducted.
- 285 newly confirmed cases, bringing total to 5,816.
- At present there are 3,601 active cases still receiving treatment, 6 of them in critical condition, and 2,205 individuals were discharged.
- 1 new mortality was recorded (a 60-year-old female Bahraini national) and no community transmission recorded.
- The Health Professions Authority gives permits to a number of private hospitals to provide optional screening services for coronavirus.
- The Ministry of Health renews its invitation to benefit from the service (telemedicine) in health centres.
- Smokers are more likely to develop severe disease with COVID-19, compared to non-smokers. (see link below).


