Data as reported by national authorities by 23:59 local time 17 May 2020

HIGHLIGHTS

- Approximately 237,000 tests were conducted.
- 209 newly confirmed cases, bringing total to 6,956.
- Out of the 209 newly confirmed cases, 67 are nationals and 142 are expatriates.
- At present there are 4,034 active cases still receiving treatment, 8 of them in critical condition; 2,910 individuals were discharged.
- No mortality recorded and no community transmission recorded.
- The Embassy of Bahrain in New Delhi and the Consulate in Mumbai evacuate Bahraini citizens from India.
- WHO: Smokers are more likely to develop severe disease with COVID-19, compared to non-smokers; WHO has published new guidance on "Cleaning and disinfection of environmental surfaces in the context of COVID-19"; WHO provided guidance on school related public health measures (see links below).


