# Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19)

Situation Report No. 61 - Kingdom of Bahrain

Data as reported by national authorities by 23:59 local time 20 May 2020

#### **HIGHLIGHTS**

- Approximately 255,600 tests were conducted.
- 514 newly confirmed cases, bringing total to 7,888.
- At present there are 4,308 active cases still receiving treatment, 9 of them in critical condition; 3,568 individuals were discharged.
- No mortality recorded and no community transmission recorded.
- Bahrain repatriates 46 Bahraini citizens from Oman.

• Civil defense: sterilization operations to reduce coronavirus adopts the sanitation principles approved by the World Health Organization.

•The Police: 210 violations were committed for those not committed to wearing a face mask in public places.

• "Takbeerat" will be held on the first day of Eid Al Fitr from 4:45 am until 5:15 am. The directorate called upon worshipers to perform the Eid Al-Fitr prayers at homes.

• WHO: Smokers are more likely to develop severe disease with COVID-19, compared to non-smokers; WHO has published new guidance on "Cleaning and disinfection of environmental surfaces in the context of COVID-19"; WHO provided guidance on school related public health measures (see links below).




