Situation Report No. 62 - Kingdom of Bahrain

Data as reported by national authorities by 23:59 local time 27 May 2020

HIGHLIGHTS

- Approximately 291,100 tests were conducted.
- 1,804 newly confirmed cases in 7 days, bringing total to 9,692.
- At present there are 4,525 active cases, 10 of them in critical condition; 5,152 individuals were discharged.
- ullet 3 new mortalities bringing total to 15; the mortalities were 53 , 44 and 59 years-old male expatriates.
- Nationality, Passports and Residence Affairs: 5,570 citizens returned to Bahrain, and 2,964 residents evacuated since stoppage of international flights.
- A new online service allowing people affected by COVID-19 to register through national platform.
- Bahrain is the first Arabian Gulf country to use medical robots in medical isolation wards.
- A comprehensive sterilisation of laboratories designated for COVID19 testing took place during the Eid Al-Fitr holiday, reducing capacity from 6000 to 3000 tests per day.
- Gulf Air imports more than 80 tons of medical supplies in May.
- WHO: Smokers are more likely to develop severe disease with COVID-19, compared to nonsmokers; WHO has published new guidance on "Cleaning and disinfection of environmental surfaces in the context of COVID-19".




