# Situation Report No. 66 - Kingdom of Bahrain

# **HIGHLIGHTS**

- Approximately 330,700 PCR tests were conducted.
- 440 newly confirmed cases, bringing total to 12,311.
- At present there are 4,885 active cases, 10 of them in critical condition; 7,407 individuals were discharged.
- No new mortalities.
- Speaker of House of Representatives made statements in support of mitigation measures while visiting/inspecting COVID-19 testing facility.
- 6 defendants fined by lower court BD 1,000 each for violating home isolation, 27 other cases are currently under investigation.
- WHO released two new documents: key planning recommendations for mass gatherings in the context of COVID-19; and, technical guidance for the prevention and control of COVID-19 across long-term care services (see links below).
- WHO lists all candidate COVID-19 vaccines in various stages of development without endorsing any of them (see link below).
