HIGHLIGHTS

• The mortalities were: 4 Bahraini citizens (62, 67, 88 years old

male and 88 years old female) and 1 male expatriate (60 years old).

• Bahrain's tourism and entertainment sector is preparing for the return of visitors, especially Saudi tourists.

• Bahrain Defence Force Hospital installs portable chambers as an advanced technology to isolate suspected COVID-19 cases.

- MoH urges the public to follow all mitigation measures.
- Gulf Air resumes direct flights to and from Athens and Cairo.

• Reducing the duration of the precautionary home guarantine from 14 to 10 days for travellers and contacts.

• Civil Defence: Precautionary sanitization operations undertaken by volunteers in their areas must be coordinated with the concerned governorate.
