HIGHLIGHTS

- The mortalities were 4 Bahraini citizens (63, 64, 90 years old male and 64 years old female).
- Solidarity trial interim results show that hydroxychloroquine and lopinavir/ritonavir produce little or no reduction in mortality of hospitalized COVID-19 patients (see link below).
- A prototype of a new COVID-fighting robot that emits ultraviolet light to disinfect public spaces and offices has been revealed.
- Head of the University of Bahrain participated in the virtual meeting to discuss the impact of the Coronavirus pandemic on higher education.
- Disinfection campaigns carried out by the Northern Governorate as part of the national efforts to combat COVID-19.
- The Information and eGovernment Authority highlighted Bahrain's digital COVID-19 response at a global ministerial conference organised by Estonia and Singapore.
- WHO releases "WHO Academy" mobile application providing COVID-19 resources for health workers in 6 UN languages.
