HIGHLIGHTS

• The Mortalities were 4 Bahraini male citizens (43, 58, 62 and

80 years old) and 2 male expatriates (54 and 65 years old).

• Ministry of Interior: 10,866 violations of not wearing the face mask in public places and shops were recorded.

• Ministry of Education: All students will return to the classes in September with the option of E- learning.

- Bahrain's anti-coronavirus experiences highlighted in a webinar organized by the Inter-Parliamentary Union.
- Healthcare workers are exempted from license renewal delay fines.
- 6.5% of daily PCR tests are positive.

Solidarity trial interim results show that hydroxychloroquine and lopinavir/ritonavir produce little or no reduction in mortality of hospitalized COVID-19 patients (see link below).




