HIGHLIGHTS

- The Mortalities are: 2 Bahraini citizens (80 years old female and 68 years old male) and 2 male expatriates (29 and 48 years old).
- Civil Defence trains 5,501 volunteers for sanitization operations.
- MoH: Incoming passengers required to shoulder the cost of mandatory COVID-19 testing (30 Bahraini Dinar) starting July 21st.
- 2 more branches of the Northern Municipality have been shut down after some employees in customer services tested positive.
- All private disability rehabilitation centres have been warned to ensure COVID-19 restrictions are fully implemented or else face fines and legal action.
- Opening swimming pools were allowed with conditions (daily sterilization of water, social separation and wearing of masks).
- Solidarity trial interim results show that hydroxychloroquine and lopinavir/ritonavir produce little or no reduction in mortality of hospitalized COVID-19 patients (see link below).
- WHO releases "WHO Academy" mobile application providing COVID-19 resources for health workers in 6 UN languages.
