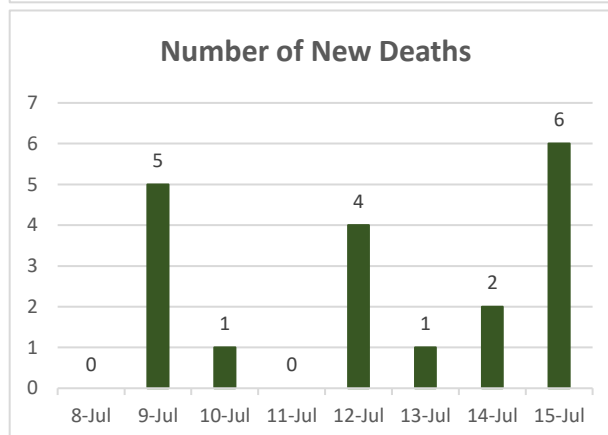
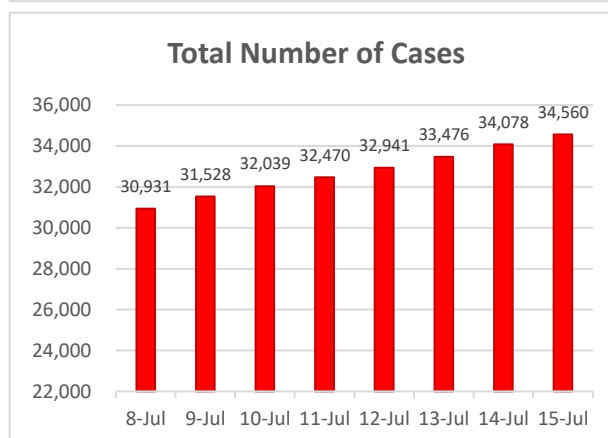
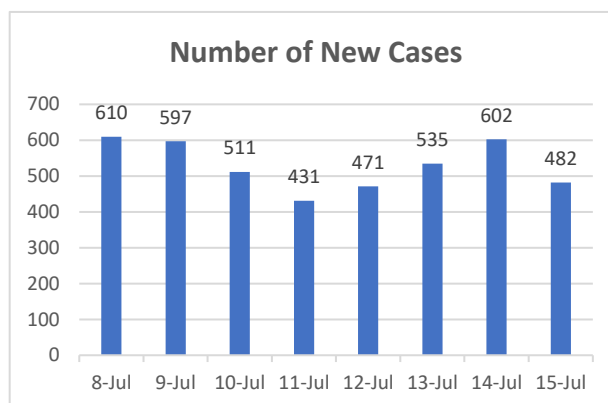

HIGHLIGHTS

- The mortalities were 3 male Bahraini citizens (51, 71 and 79 years old) and 3 male expatriates (41, 44 and 73 years old).
- Continuation of the suspension of prayers in mosques and disruption of group worship.
- Strict cleanliness and sanitisation guidelines have been issued for reopening of swimming pools after private and public swimming pools have been closed since March.
- 100-car park drive-in cinema at the iconic Bahrain Bay will be opened from July 22.
- MoH published the method of sterilizing the house in a simple and clear way through its account on twitter.
- "Tamkeen" to double and extend its financial grants to enterprises adversely affected by COVID-19 repercussions.
- UN report forecasts increase in hunger and malnutrition globally as a result of COVID-19; in 2019 it was estimated that 690 million people went hungry, by the end of 2020 the number may increase by an additional 130 million.
