HIGHLIGHTS

- The mortalities were 5 Bahraini citizens (48, 58, and 69 years old male and 53 and 76 years old female) and 2 male expatriates (50 and 55 years old)
- 12,800 violation of not wearing the face mask since the implementation of the decision began.
- MOH: a new update on its COVID19 contact tracing page where a weekly summary of clusters of active cases will be uploaded.
- MoH receives 10,000 reusable face masks produced by the Royal Humanitarian Foundation in cooperation with productive families.
- Abattoirs to implement precautionary measures to limit the spread of the Coronavirus especially during Eid Al-Adha.
- More than 715,000 people (40 % of Bahrain's population) have been tested for the coronavirus.
- UN report forecasts increase in hunger and malnutrition globally as a result of COVID-19; in 2019 it was estimated that 690 million people went hungry, by the end of 2020 the number may increase by an additional 130 million, see link below.
