

EPIDEMIOLOGICAL HIGHLIGHTS

- **COVID-19 cases and deaths:** As of 12 February 2022, the Eastern Mediterranean Region has reported 20 358 490 confirmed COVID-19 cases and 326 908 deaths since the start of the pandemic.
- **Epidemiological trend:** during the reporting period, in comparison with the previous two weeks:
 - The number of reported cases increased by 39%.
 - The number of reported deaths decreased by 97%.
 - The number of conducted tests stabilized.
 - 10 and 17 countries reported increase in cases and deaths respectively.
 - Two countries reported a simultaneous decrease in cases and deaths.
- **COVID-19 testing:** The total number of tests in the Region has reached 336 028 755 with a median cumulative positivity ratio of 9.8% (range from 0.7% to 33.6%).
- Variants of concern (VOCs):
 - 21 countries/territories in the Region have officially reported the detection of the Alpha VOC.
 - 18 countries/territories in the Region have officially reported the detection of the Beta VOC.
 - 6 countries/territories in the Region have officially reported the detection of the Gamma VOC.
 - 18 countries/territories in the Region have officially reported the detection of the Delta VOC.
 - 16 countries/territories in the Region have officially reported the detection of the Omicron VOC.

Map 2: Countries reporting SARS-CoV-2 Variants of Concern (VOCs) in the Eastern Mediterranean Region







Graph 1: Weekly distribution of COVID-19 cases in the Eastern Mediterranean Region

REGIONAL RESPONSE HIGHLIGHTS

Partnership and Coordination

- maintained regular communication with partners, sharing information on COVID-19, and received updates from partners.
- established links with health cluster teams in Fragile, Conflict and Vulnerable (FCV) settings, and explored strengthening communication and collaboration with WHO Country Offices.

Operations Support and Logistics

- dispatched US\$ 850 000 in health supplies during the reporting period.
- coordinated a charter flight to Kabul, Afghanistan, containing critical laboratory reagents and supplies as well as biomedical equipment.

Essential Health Services and Systems

- initiated the assessment of frontline services in Bahrain and Iraq.
- finalized the pulse survey results for countries of the Region.

COVID-19 Vaccine

- conducted an orientation for six priority countries on the new COVID-19 Vaccine Delivery Partnership through which partners will support countries in an accelerated and concerted manner.
- held country support team calls for six priority countries with low vaccination coverage.
- monitored the allocation and acceptance of the next round of COVID-19 vaccines through COVAX.

COVID-19 vaccination coverage in the Eastern Mediterranean Region 10 February 2022

Over 622.5 million vaccine doses have been administered in the Region.



- Population having received at least one dose: 44%
- Fully vaccinated population: 36%
- Partially vaccinated population: 8%

Infection Prevention and Control in Yemen

From 9 to 22 December 2021, WHO's Regional Office for the Eastern Mediterranean deployed an Infection Prevention and Control (IPC) expert alongside two experts from WHO Headquarters, to Yemen. The technical mission supported the country (WHO Country Office Yemen and the Ministry of Public Health and Population) in reviewing the IPC measures of response to the ongoing COVID-19 outbreak, identified and documented strengths and areas of improvement, and provided recommendations to scale up the overall response. Mission recommendations have now been finalized and shared with the WHO Country Office.
