Box 1 Diagnostic criteria for tension-type headache and migraine (adapted from the International Headache Society [14]

Tension-type headache

- A. At least 10 previous headache fulfilling criteria below
- B. Headache lasting from 30 minutes to 7 days
- C. At least 2 of the following pain characteristics:
 - 1. Pressing (non pulsating) quality
 - 2. Mild or moderate intensity (may inhibit but doesn't prohibit activities)
 - 3. Bilateral location.
 - 4. Not aggravated by climbing stairs or similar routine physical activity.
- D. Both of the following:1. No nausea or vomiting
 - 2. Photophobia and phonophobia are absent, or only one is present

Migraine headache

- A. At least 5 attacks fulfilling criteria belowB. Headache lasting 4 to 72 hours(2 to 48 in children)
- C. Headache characterized by at least two of the following:
 1. Unilateral location
 - 2. Pulsating quality
 - 3. Moderate or severe intensity (inhibits

the following:

- or prohibits daily activity)

 4. Aggravated by climbing stairs or similar routine physical activity

 D. Headache accompanied by at least 1 of
 - 1. Nausea or vomiting, or both.
