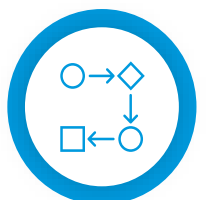

## Regional action plan

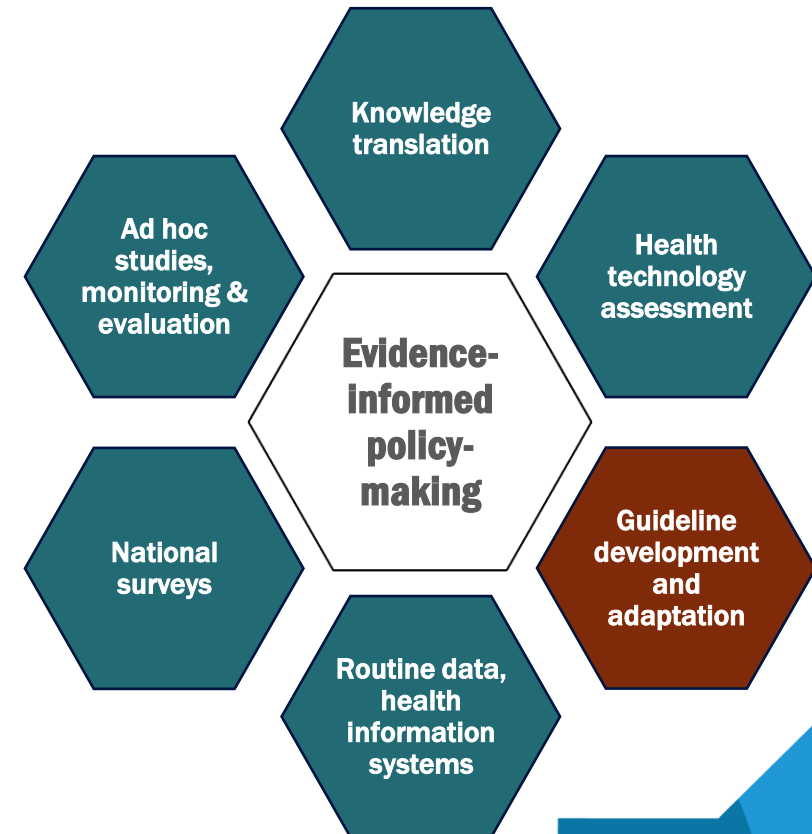
for the implementation of the framework for action to improve national institutional capacity for the use of evidence in health policy-making in the Eastern Mediterranean Region

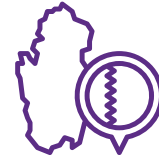

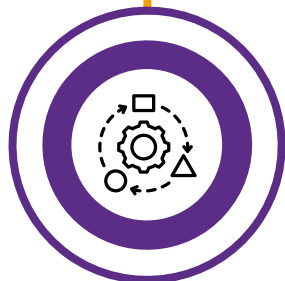

# What is a national guideline program?



## Ecosystem / Infrastructure

- ✓ Laws, regulations and commitment
- ✓ National technical, financial and human resource capacity
- ✓ Stakeholder engagement



## Development / adaptation

- ✓ National steering committee
- ✓ Robust methods and quality assurance
- ✓ National roadmap for action



## Guidelines impact

- ✓ Dissemination and implementation plans
- ✓ Monitoring and evaluation
- ✓ Accountability and responsiveness

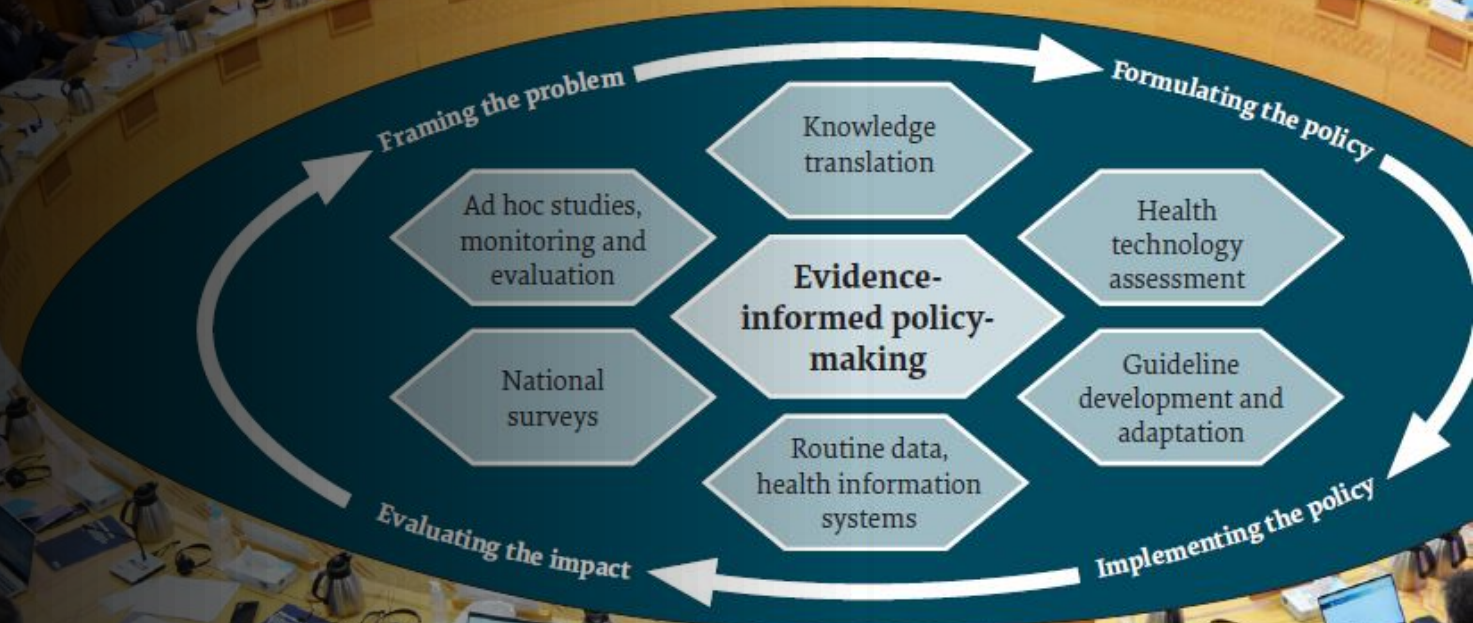


## Lessons learnt from country experiences in establishing national guideline programmes

- High-level policymakers' commitment
- Brining all the stakeholders to the table
- Expanding national capacities for action



# Responsibilities of a national guideline programme



# 1) Adoption of a guideline for use in the country

- From another country or international society
- Developed nationally by a professional society or health care entity in the country
- Responsibilities of the national programme:
  1. Ensuring it addresses the needs
  2. Ensuring it is developed using valid approaches
    - Apply appraisal tools for assessment of the guidelines  
e.g. AGREE II
  3. If it meets the criteria AND requires no change or update
  4. Adopted and released as the national guideline or recommendation within a guideline

## 2) De novo development

- If there is no notable existing guideline to respond to the needs
- Or when the guidelines are assessed and are not of acceptable quality and/or do not address the needs

3) there are existing guidelines, that require adaptation

- Why adapt?
  1. Context affects applicability and use of a guideline
    - Health care setting and practices
    - Disease profile
    - Availability of resources
  2. Adaptation is more cost effective and less resource intensive
- Valid adaptation of guideline requires following **steps and approaches to ensure the adapted guideline is valid and reliable**

# Guideline adaptation flowchart

1. **Priority setting** of the topic and main questions the guideline is going to address

2. Establishing the **Guideline Development Group (GDG)** and the **Technical Support Team (TST)**

3. Finalizing the **scope** of the guideline and formulating **PICO question**

4. Searching, critical appraisal and **selection** of eligible local or global **guidelines for adaptation**

5. **Updating evidence**, where required

6. Adopting, revising or **updating recommendations**

7. **Review and clearance** of the adapted guideline

8. **Dissemination, implementation and monitoring and evaluation of guideline**

9. **Plan for updating** the guideline
