Data as reported by national authorities by 23:59 local time 06 May 2020

HIGHLIGHTS

- 485 new cases, bringing total to 6,289. Of the new cases 99 are nationals.
- All new cases are contacts of cases or are under investigation.
- 2 new mortalities recorded, bringing total to 42.
- 4,028 cases remain under treatment, 88 of them are in ICU, out of those in ICU 40 are in a critical condition.
- Recovery of 187 cases bringing total to 2,219.
- 4, 715 individuals are quarantined.
- No community transmission has been reported so far.
- The end of the fourth and final phase of repatriating Kuwaiti citizens.
- Kuwait committed to resuming education August 4th.
- Two flights will operate each week to return 600 Bangladeshi migrants home and Kuwait will bear the flight operation expenses for the workers.




