HIGHLIGHTS

- 1,073 new cases, bringing total to 16,764. Of the new cases 231 are nationals.
- All new cases are contacts of cases or are under investigation.
- 3 new mortalities, bringing total to 121.
- 11,962 cases remain under treatment, 179 of them are in ICU.
- Recovery of 342 coronavirus cases bringing total to 4,681.
- Officials examine plans for repatriating illegal residents.
- Kuwait Football Association: Sports activity will return on September 11th after approval of health authorities.
- Ministry of Awqaf: Muslims can perform Eid Prayers at home.
- WHO: Smokers are more likely to develop severe disease with COVID-19, compared to non-smokers; WHO has published new guidance on "Cleaning and disinfection of environmental surfaces in the context of COVID-19"; WHO provided guidance on school related public health measures (see links below).
