




On 9th May 2022, WHO Country Representative Pakistan Dr Palitha Mahipala met with Chief Executive Officer DRAP Mr. Asim Rauf and the Executive Director National Institute of Health (NIH) Maj. Gen. Prof Dr Aamer Ikram. Following the meeting WR handed over reagents, chemicals, and supplies to the National Control Laboratory for Biologicals (NCLB) to upscale vaccine lot release testing. WHO also provided assistance to the NIH's Biological Production Division in order to increase the nation's vaccine manufacturing capacity. The ceremony took place at the WHO Country Office in Islamabad.

During his speech, Dr Palitha noted that these contributions demonstrated WHO's commitment to advancing the vaccine production in Pakistan. The WR stressed the importance of facilitating networking and harmonization between vaccine producers and regulators inside and outside the country. He reiterates WHO's support for DRAP and the NIH

Maj. Gen. Aamer Ikram and Mr. Asim thanked Dr Palitha for the donation and praised WHO Pakistan for its assistance. They pledged to working together for the benefit of Pakistan
