SITUATION OVERVIEW


- Monitoring Diseases Trend in flood affected districts.
 - The COVID-19 positivity rate in Pakistan has increased to 1.19% as of epi-week 16 of 2023 from 0.90% as of epi week 15 of 2023. Islamabad, Karachi, Lahore, and Multan are among the most affected districts.
 - In epi-week 16, the Malaria positivity rate decreased to 13% as compared to 14% in epi-week 15 regardless of the increase in number of suspected malaria cases tested.
 - The malaria data from 60 stratum 1 districts (epidemic prone districts) particularly from Balochistan show normal malaria endemicity status. This could be partially attributed to under reporting (<30%) from districts.
 - There is need to continue close monitoring of the cases of vector and water borne diseases.

WHO RESPONSE

- **Support to RMNCH Services:**
 - Department of Health Sindh in collaboration with World Health Organization Pakistan organized refresher training of health facility staff on Maternal and Perinatal Death Surveillance and Response (MPDSR) at Shaikh Zahid Women Hospital (SZWH) Larkana. Participants included nursing staff from Obs/Gyne, pediatrics, anesthesiology, medicine, surgical ICU and hospital administration. Similar training was conducted at Jinnah Postgraduate Medical Center (JPMC) Karachi.
- **Support to response to cases of severe malnutrition with complications:**
 - A total of **16,104 children** have so far been treated in WHO supported NSCs in the flood affected districts across Pakistan. This number is up from 15,442 children treated in the WHO supported NSC sites in epi week 15 of 2023. Performance indicators for these NSCs are **93.76% children cured**, 1.33% died and 4.91% defaulted.
- **Support to VPD Surveillance:**
 - Department of Health, Balochistan in collaboration with WHO Pakistan conducted a three-day Training of VPD surveillance officers and data analyst drawn from the flood affected districts. Secretary Health, Government of Balochistan, Additional Secretary Health and Project Coordinator EPI inaugurated the training. Participants included 50 newly recruited VPD Surveillance officers and data analyst








(1st January 2022 till date)




