





Summary Table by Province

On 29th January 2022, WHO Country Representative Pakistan Dr Palitha Mahipala along with Incident Manager WHO Pakistan Dr Michael Lukwiya conducted a virtual meeting with all WHO National and International staff based in Pakistan.

The purpose of the meeting was to update the WHO staff on the current upsurge of COVID-19 cases in the country and the response by the Government. In the meeting, Dr Palitha explained that the Omicron variant can spread more rapidly than the earlier SARS-CoV-2 virus variants. Due to this high level of community transmission, burden on health system has increased substantially. He also highlighted the importance of the technical support by the WHO in strengthening the government response.

Dr Palitha underlined the need to improve the implementation of public health measures, the use of masks, social distancing, and hand hygiene practices.
