Summary Table by Province

On 30th December 2021, WHO Country Representative Pakistan Dr Palitha Mahipala met with the Secretary Primary & Secondary Health Care Department, Punjab Mr Imran Sikandar Baloch at his office in Lahore.

During the meeting, Dr Palitha appreciated department of health for the efforts and achievements in the door to door (RED) vaccination campaign for COVID-19. WR discussed the presence of Omicron variant in the province and its possible impact on the health system. He emphasized on the preparation and the enhanced response capacity and implementation of public health and social measures to control the spread of the infection.

Secretary Health Punjab acknowledged the continuing support of WHO especially for Media training workshops and other areas during COVID-19 Pandemic. He requested WHO to extend its technical assistance in implementation of UHC BF essential health services package and in the development of business model for public sector hospitals for health insurance programs.
