

National Institute of Health, Ministry of National Health Services Regulations and Coordination in collaboration with World Health Organization Pakistan conducted a National Consultation Workshop on "Support to Improve Food Safety strategy in Pakistan" on 9th December 2021 at Marriott Hotel Islamabad. Parliamentary Secretary for Health, Dr Nausheen Hamid, WHO Country Representative Pakistan, Dr Palitha Mahipala, Executive Director NIH, Maj Gen. Prof. Dr. Aamer Ikram and Director Nutrition Dr. Abdul Baseer Khan Achakzai, graced the inaugural session.

In his remarks, Dr Palitha highlighted that Food borne diseases are common in Pakistan and pose challenges to public health. He affirmed that WHO Pakistan will continue its full support and guidance to the national and provincial stakeholders in their efforts to reduce the risks of morbidity, disability, and mortality associated with unsafe food and hazards.

Dr Nausheen Hamid appreciated the WHO support to the Nutrition Wing for the improvement of food safety regime in the country, through engaging food safety stakeholders and process of consultation.
