17.06.2014 (Week 24)**
IDP status

Recent updates in; as circulated by UNOCHA DIKhan, there has been no movement from NWA for the last three days because of imposition of curfew on Miranshah Bannu road (since 13th June, 2014).

- Linkage with District Bannu is through the following Three routes;
 - Miran Shah Road entering Bannu Through UC Mamash Khel
 - Nurar and Haved Road UC Nurar from FR Bannu
 - Shal Gazai Bridge UC Daryoba from FR Bannu
- Linkage with District Hangu
 - Biland Khel Bridge UC Thall Urban District Hangu
- Linkage with District Lakki Marwat is through Nurar Road (District Bannu).
- District DI khan is accessed through Chunda Check post via Lakki Marwat.

Majority of IDPs have moved to Bannu, with some families to DIKhan and Tank. (The IDPs who have moved to DIKhan and Tank are reported by OCHA through various sources). A transit camp is established at Bakkakhel (near Air Port). IDP Families are scattered all over the district and have either rented out houses or are living with the host community. This is to mention that in-charge of almost all health facilities in the district are trained by W.H.O on DEWS

DHO Bannu informed us that a major camp will be established at Ghashu check post (Bannu link road) which could accommodate 100K people. As of writing, govt. officials are finalizing the modalities.

Situation Updates:

- Two mobile medical teams are destined by DoH for the transit IDP camp at Bakkakhel.
- The teams includes Doctors and Paramedical staff and ambulance for referral cases
- Members of the team are already trained by W.H.O on DEWS, with respect to case definitions, investigations and management of communicable diseases.
- EPI teams accompany the medical teams in order to vaccinate the children against VPD.
- MnCH services are not provided yet at the camp but such cases will be referred to Bannu.
- W.H.O had already pre-positioned 10 Emergency Health Kits (EHKs) sufficient for 90000 individuals for one month for potential/expected IDPs. The same kits are being utilized for the IDPs in the camp.
- After announcement of proper camp for IDPs, the mobile medical teams will be swapped to Fixed health facility in camp and the health teams will provide 24/7 services
- Refresher DEWS training may be conducted for teams as well as other points of interest.

NEEDS:

- DHO requested for 5-6 more EHKs and, in addition, couple of Diarrheal Treatment Kits (DTKs). EHK were provided some months back and there is still reserve stock in place but owing to estimated IDPs, more medicines will be required. The need for medicine may be more subject to population at target
- As per DHO, there are only 5 ambulances all over the district (two at the DHQ hospital, one at KGN hospital and two at the DHO office). Keeping in view the loads of people, more ambulances will be needed. SDF funded ambulances are handed over to DIKhan with the intent that the district (being the focal/sentinel point for southern region) will facilitate others in emergency situations.
- Safe drinking water remains a problem for IDPs who might reside in the camps. Representative of PDMA was also concerned about provision of safe drinking water when we met him couple of weeks ago.

- MnCH services are not provided at the camp situation but ambulance will be available to take cases to referred sites
