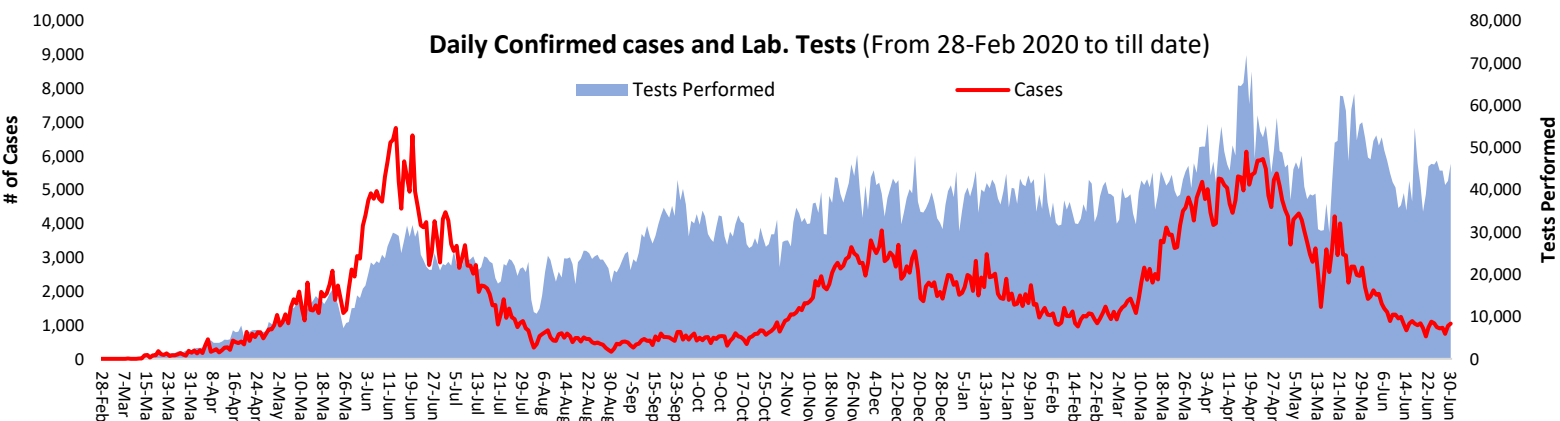

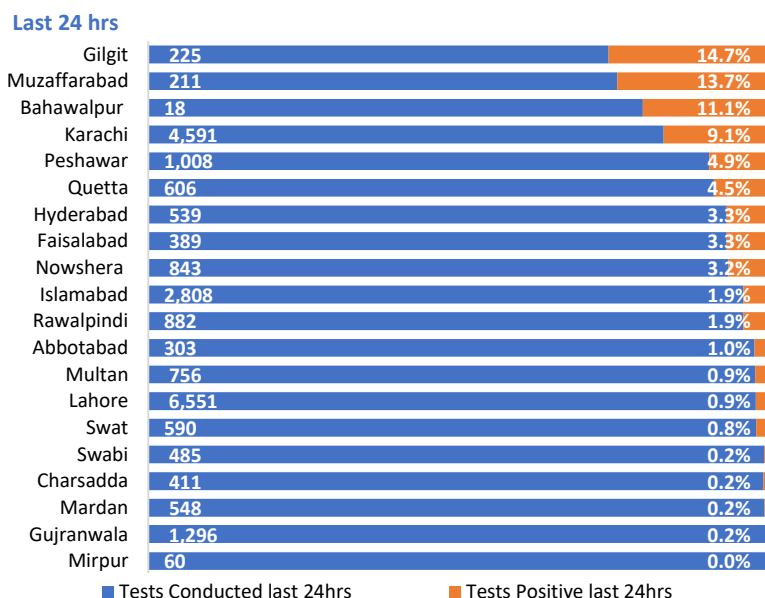

On 30th June 2021, the World Health Organization (WHO) Pakistan in collaboration with Drug Regulatory Authority of Pakistan (DRAP) & Expanded Program on Immunization (EPI) conducted training of 30 participants from EPI and DRAP from across the country on strengthening pharmacovigilance through improving AEFI reporting & case investigation at Ramada Hotel, Islamabad. The opening ceremony was attended by WHO Country Representative Pakistan, Dr Palitha Mahipala, Chief Executive Officer DRAP Dr Asim Rauf and National Program Manager EPI, Dr Muhammad Akram.

In his speech, the WR informed the audience that COVID 19 Vaccination is the most heavily deployed public health intervention against the pandemic and called for collective responsibility in monitoring and reporting of the adverse events following COVID-19 vaccines.

Dr Asim acknowledged WHO technical assistance to DRAP in acquiring international accreditation and enhancing effectiveness in pharmacovigilance.
