



INCIDENCE & DEATHS BY DATE




TOTAL CASES & CASES PER MILLION POP.




Pakistan reported **2,458** new cases of COVID-19 on **30** November **2020**. The total number of cases notified since the beginning of the outbreak is **400,482** with **8,091** deaths (CFR: **2.02%**). Out of the total **49,105** currently active cases, **2,680** cases are hospitalized.

MEETINGS & COORDINATION

Today, 1st December 2020, World Health Organization Pakistan in collaboration with National AIDS control program conducted a Webinar on World AIDS Day 2020 with theme "National Solidarity - Resilience of HIV services" The objective of the webinar was to advocate for building gender sensitive resilient HIV health services and to advocate for continuity of services for people living with and affected by HIV during emergencies, highlighting the crucial role of the community.

WHO country representative Pakistan, Dr Palitha Mahipala inaugurated the session. During the WRs opening remarks he highlighted that Partnership with civil society has been key in ensuring continued engagement with HIV service clients, maintaining continuity of their services and supporting their adherence; he thanked civil society organizations for their longstanding role in empowering PLHIV and for their crucial work. He assured that WHO Pakistan remain committed to continue supporting the efforts of Government, and other stakeholders in maintain essential health services and strengthen health systems to increase their resilience.
