

Executive Summary

Pakistan reported 441 new cases of COVID-19 on 1 September 2020. The total number of cases notified since the beginning of the outbreak is 296,590 with 6,318 deaths (CFR: 2.13%). Out of the total 8,813 currently active cases, 1,039 cases are hospitalized, out of which **584 (56.20%)** are in critical condition. **7,774** COVID-19 positive cases are at designated isolation facilities or inhome isolation. A total of 281,459 (94.89%) have recovered and discharged.








COVID-19 Confirmed cases & CFR

by Major Cities / Districts



FLOOD SITUATION

There has been a recent spell of heavy rains causing floods in many parts of the country and resulting in human loss, infrastructure and property damage. According to NDMA, Overall, 853 houses have been partially damaged whereas 1307 houses are fully damaged in the country. The overall number of deaths is 176 whereas total number of injured people is 101.

Sindh is the worst hit province and experiencing the worst floods in recent history. The heavy rains started in the province from Sunday the 23rd August 2020 causing severe urban floods and damaging 368 houses partially and 254 fully. Sindh recorded number of deaths as 72 whereas number of injured people is 22. Approximately 138,706 people have been displaced in Sindh whereas 131 Health facilities have been damaged due to floods.




WHO Response to Flood

Today, September 2, 2020, The WHO country representative Pakistan Dr Palitha Mahipala donated supplies worth of 21 Million to Chairman, National Disaster Management Authority (NDMA) Lt. Gen Muhammad Afzal.

The Donation included 20 Interagency Health emergency Kits (IEHK) containing medicines for 75,000 people for 1 month to meet different health needs in humanitarian emergencies.
