



Executive Summary


Pakistan reported **424** new cases of COVID-19 on **2 September 2020**. The total number of cases notified since the beginning of the outbreak is **297,014** with **6,328** deaths (CFR: **2.13%)**. Out of the total **8,716** currently active cases, **1,054** cases are hospitalized, out of which **585 (55.50%)** are in critical condition. **7,707** COVID-19 positive cases are at designated isolation facilities or inhome isolation. A total of **281,925 (94.91%)** have recovered and discharged.





Daily Incidence by Province






Daily COVID-19 Positivity Rate




COVID-19 Confirmed cases & CFR by Major Cities / Districts

FLOOD SITUATION

There has been a recent spell of heavy rains causing floods in many parts of Pakistan, resulting in human loss, infrastructure and property damage. According to NDMA, Overall, **929 houses** have been partially damaged whereas **1,316 houses** are fully damaged. The overall number of deaths is **189, with over 128 people injured**.

Sindh is the worst affected province. The heavy rains started in the province from Sunday the 23rd August 2020 causing severe urban floods and damaging. Over 368 houses partially and **254** fully damaged. Over **72** deaths with 22 injuries recorded in Sindh province. Approximately **138,706** people have been displaced and **131** Health facilities have been damaged due to floods.




