

Executive Summary

Pakistan reported **675** new cases of COVID-19 on **04 August 2020**. The total number of cases notified since the beginning of the outbreak is **281,136** with **6,014** deaths **(CFR: 2.13%)**. Out of the total **20,836** currently active cases, **1,381** cases are hospitalized, out of which **872 (63.14%)** are in critical condition. **19,455** COVID-19 positive cases are at designated isolation facilities or inhome isolation. A total of **254,286(90.44%)** have recovered and discharged.

Daily incidence of COVID-19 cases in Pakistan






COVID-19 case density/million Population

Daily Mortality in Pakistan






Meeting & Coordination



Maintaining Essential Health Services in Pakistan


Vaccination coverage in Pakistan has been affected by the COVID-19 outbreak. In June, WHO supported the government of Pakistan through outreach sessions modelled "Enhanced Outreach Activities" in all districts of KP, Balochistan, and Punjab. In Sindh it was conducted in Karachi, Dadu and Tharparkar. As a result, over **4.1 million** vaccine doses were administered.






COVID-19 confirmed cases & CFR (%) by districts
